

**MINUTES OF THE DIVERSITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE &

Vonda McDaniel, Chair of the DBE & Procurement Committee, opened the meeting for business.

ACTION: Willie McDonald made a motion to approve the Diversity Business Enterprise & Procurement Committee minutes of April 29, 2010. The motion was seconded by Vonda McDaniel and approved unanimously by the committee.

Ms. McDaniel began by asking Gary Schalmo to give a project update. There was a brief discussion about Greyhound.

Roxianne Bethune was then asked to report. She began by talking about the Surety Assistance Program. There was discussion about the training process.

She then discussed and there was conversation about the networking events, vendor fairs, and attendance at those events. (Attachment #1)

Ms Bethune then walked through the quarterly reports that are sent to the State. (Attachment #2) There was discussion about the reporting information received and how that is gathered. She then reviewed the DBE participation numbers for the quarter. (Attachment #3) She noted for the money spent during the quarter we were at 17% DBE participation but for the money spent to date on the project we are at 22% DBE participation. Submitted herewith is the quarterly Music City Center Compliance Report for the period of April 1 to June 30th, 2010. This report includes project spending with minority and non-minority contractors, vendors, suppliers and professional service providers. It includes the procurement dollars spent and percentages for the 2nd quarter- CY- 2010 in the initial stages of construction of the convention center project. With final approval in late January behind us, site demolition, utility relocation and excavation nearly completed ending with the final building in the project foot print (Greyhound), our site preparation is nearly completed.

The 2nd quarter construction phase of the project has a total of 16 minority contractors. Of that number all are local with the exception of 3 out of town contractors.

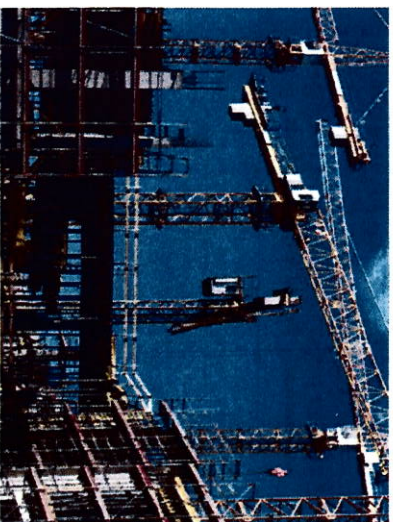
