The 53rd meeting of the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County (CCA) was held on August 14, 2014 at 9:05 a.m., in the Administrative Board Room of the Administrative Offices at the Music City Center, Nashville, Tennessee.

The meeting was opened for business by Chairman Marty Dickens who stated that a quorum was present.

ACTION: Appeal of Decisions from the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County – Pursuant to the provisions of § 2.68.030 of the Metropolitan Code of Laws, please take notice that decisions of the Convention Center Authority may be appealed if and to the extent applicable to the Chancery Court of Davidson County for review under a common law writ of certiorari. These appeals must be filed within sixty days after entry of a final decision by the Authority. Any person or other entity considering an appeal should consult with private legal counsel to ensure that any such appeals are timely and that all procedural requirements are met.

Charles Starks introduced Beverly Bennett as the new Executive Assistant.

ACTION: Francis Guess made a motion to approve the 52nd Meeting Minutes of July 10, 2014. The motion was seconded by Willie McDonald and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Chairman Dickens noted that the next meeting is currently scheduled for September 11, 2014.

Charles Starks was asked to discuss the KPMG and Hoskins & Company extension and there was discussion.

ACTION: Willie McDonald made a motion approving the amendment of the KPMG engagement letter extending the engagement for a subsequent year to cover the audit of financial statements as of and for the year-ended June 30, 2014 and authorizing Mr. Dickens to execute the amendment and take any actions necessary or appropriate to formalize that amendment. The motion was seconded by Francis Guess and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Charles Starks then discussed the installation of a distributed antennae system in the Country Music Hall of Fame.

ACTION: Mona Lisa Warren made a motion authorizing the Country Music Hall of Fame's installation of the Distributed Antenna System in the Expansion Space and authorizing Charles Starks to provide such written consent on behalf of the Authority. The motion was seconded by Willie McDonald and approved unanimously by the Authority with Francis Guess abstaining.

Charles Starks gave a report on how ASAE went this past week. (Attachment #1)

Jasmine Quattlebaum reported on the quarterly DBE numbers and there was discussion. (Attachment #1 and #2)

Charles Starks then gave additional operations updates and a tax collection update and there was discussion. (Attachment #1)

With no additional business a motion was made to adjourn, with no objection the CCA adjourned at 10:01 a.m.
