The 57th meeting of the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County (CCA) was held on March 12, 2015 at 9:00 a.m., in the Administrative Conference Room of the Administrative Offices at the Music City Center, Nashville, Tennessee.

The meeting was opened for business at 9:00 am by Chair Marty Dickens who stated that a quorum was present.

Charles Starks introduced Aaron Haviland, new Director of Security for the Music City Center.

The next regularly scheduled meeting is scheduled for April 9, 2015.

ACTION: Appeal of Decisions from the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County – Pursuant to the provisions of § 2.68.030 of the Metropolitan Code of Laws, please take notice that decisions of the Convention Center Authority may be appealed if and to the extent applicable to the Chancery Court of Davidson County for review under a common law writ of certiorari. These appeals must be filed within sixty days after entry of a final decision by the Authority. Any person or other entity considering an appeal should consult with private legal counsel to ensure that any such appeals are timely and that all procedural requirements are met.

ACTION: Francis Guess made a motion to approve the 56th Meeting Minutes of February 9, 2015. The motion was seconded by Vonda McDaniel and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Rich Riebeling gave an update on the Omni Estoppel Agreement and there was discussion concerning Omni undertaking a financial package that would include its Nashville hotel as contemplated by the original agreements.

ACTION: Willie McDaniel made a motion [i] approving a Pledge of Rights Under Intergovernmental Project Agreement for Security Purposes between the Authority and Omni Nashville, LLC along with the Estoppel Certificates Regarding the Development and Funding Agreement and Room Block and Meeting Space Agreement and [ii] authorizing Marty Dickens to finalize and execute the Pledge Agreement and Estoppel Certificates on behalf of the Authority in substantially the form now before this meeting or with such changes therein as shall be approved by him, his execution to constitute conclusive evidence of the approval of any and all such changes or revisions, in the name, and on behalf, of the Authority, and to take any further actions as he deems necessary or appropriate in connection with the foregoing. The motion was seconded by Francis Guess and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Francis Guess gave an update on the Finance & Budget Committee.

ACTION: Francis Guess made a motion adopting the recommendation of the Finance & Audit Committee and approving the 2016 Fiscal Year Operating Budget funding the activities and operations of the Music City Center. The motion was seconded by Irwin Fisher and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Marty Dickens gave an update on the Executive Committee.

With no additional business a motion was made to adjourn, with no objection the Authority adjourned at 9:22 a.m.
