MINUTES OF THE 66th MEETING OF THE CONVENTION CENTER AUTHORITY OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE & DAVIDSON COUNTY

The 66th meeting of the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County (CCA) was held on July 14, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. in the Administrative Conference Room of the Administrative Offices at the Music City Center, Nashville, Tennessee.

Chair Marty Dickens opened the meeting for business at 9:03 a.m. and stated that a quorum was present.

ACTION: Appeal of Decisions from the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County – Pursuant to the provisions of § 2.68.030 of the Metropolitan Code of Laws, please take notice that decisions of the Convention Center Authority may be appealed if and to the extent applicable to the Chancery Court of Davidson County for review under a common law writ of certiorari. These appeals must be filed within sixty days after entry of a final decision by the Authority. Any person or other entity considering an appeal should consult with private legal counsel to ensure that any such appeals are timely and that all procedural requirements are met.

David McMurry was introduced as a new Authority Member.

ACTION: Randy Goodman made a motion to approve the 65th Meeting Minutes of May 4, 2016. Willie McDonald seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously by the Authority.

The next regularly scheduled meeting is scheduled for August 4, 2016.

ACTION: Willie McDonald made a motion that, pursuant to Article IV of the bylaws, Marty Dickens be elected as Chair, Vonda McDaniel as Vice-Chair, and Mona Lisa Warren as Secretary and Treasurer. The motion was seconded by Randy Goodman, and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Charles Starks gave an operations update (Attachment #1), and there was discussion.

Charles Starks and Jasmine Quattlebaum presented the RFP for Compensation and Benefits Analysis (Attachment #2), and there was discussion.

ACTION: Vonda McDaniel made a motion [i] accepting the recommendation of the evaluation committee and [ii] authorizing Charles Starks to negotiate and execute an agreement with Cushion Employer Services for compensation and benefits analysis on substantially the same terms as set forth in the RFP and considered this day. Mona Lisa Warren seconded the motion, and the Authority approved unanimously.

Charles Starks reported that Music City Center was honored recently with the 2016 Governor's Environmental Stewardship Award in the Pursuit of Excellence category.

Charles Starks presented an update on sustainability improvements for the parking garage. Nine electric vehicle (EV) car charging stations were recently installed. All light fixtures in the garage were recently retrofitted with the KOBI Electric T8 LED lamp, which was partially paid through a grant from TVA's Energy Right program.

Charles Starks reported that Elisa Putman was recently selected for the 2016-2017 class of Leadership Middle Tennessee.

Charles Starks presented an update on Tax Collections, and there was discussion.

With no additional business, the Authority unanimously moved to adjourn at 9:42 a.m.
