MINUTES OF THE 125th MEETING OF THE CONVENTION CENTER AUTHORITY OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE DAVIDSON COUNTY

The 125th meeting of the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County (CCA) was held on January 4, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. in the Administrative Conference Room of the Administrative Offices at Music City Center, Nashville, Tennessee.

Chair Norah Buikstra opened the meeting for business at 9:04 a.m.

ACTION: Appeal of Decisions from the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County – Pursuant to the provisions of § 2.68.030 of the Metropolitan Code of Laws, please take notice that decisions of the Convention Center Authority may be appealed if and to the extent applicable to the Chancery Court of Davidson County for review under a common law writ of certiorari. These appeals must be filed within sixty days after entry of a final decision by the Authority. Any person or other entity considering an appeal should consult with private legal counsel to ensure that any such appeals are timely and that all procedural requirements are met.

Chair Norah Buikstra read the Music City Center Mission Statement.

There were no public comment requests received for this meeting (Attachment #1).

ACTION: Alfred Degrafinreid II made a motion to approve the 124th Meeting Minutes of December 7, 2023. The motion was seconded by Vonda McDaniel and approved unanimously by the Authority.

The next regularly scheduled meeting is scheduled for Thursday, February 1, 2024, at 9:00 a.m.

Charles Starks shared Elisa Putman, former COO, will officially retire in February 2024 after 35 years of dedicated service to the Music City Center, and there was discussion.

Charles Starks and Jasmine Quattlebaum provided information on the Food & Beverage Contract Renewal, noting the existing seamless relationship between Music City Center and Sodexo Live (Attachments #1 and #2), and there was discussion.

ACTION: Seema Prasad made a motion authorizing Charles Starks to negotiate and execute an amendment to the Food and Beverage Services Agreement with Volume Services, Inc. d/b/a Sodexo Live! exercising the Convention Center Authority's option to extend the agreement for an additional two years until April 30, 2026 on substantially the same terms as considered this day. The motion was seconded by Robert Davidson and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Charles Starks provided an update on the monthly STR, LLC Hotel Statistics, tax revenues (Attachment #1), and there was discussion.

With no additional business, the Authority unanimously moved to adjourn at 9:53 a.m.



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

MCC Portion of October 2023 Tourism Tax Collections


